

### **CSP's Professional Judgment Policy**

The discretion granted by law that the FAA (Financial Aid Administrator) can determine that a single student from a group of students has an unusual circumstance or that adjustments need to be made to the need analysis. These decisions are made on a case-by-case basis and not across the board for a group of students.

# Unusual circumstances: Dependency Override

Examples, but not limited to

- Parental abandonment
- Incarceration
- Refugee or asylee status
- Human trafficking

Special circumstances: COA (Cost of Attendance) and SAI (Student Aid Index) Appeal Examples, but not limited to

- Loss of employment
- Unusual family medical/dental expenses not covered by insurance
- Tuition expenses at an elementary/secondary school for the students siblings or dependents
- Extraordinary dependent care expenses
- Divorce of a dependent students parent or of an independent student
- Death of a dependent students parent or of an independent students spouse

# **Documentation- Student and Family**

This type of documentation is collected from the student and/or family to support the request for special consideration:

Examples of documentation can include, but are not limited to

- Written explanations of special circumstances being experienced by the student or parent
- Third-party (teachers, counselors, social workers, ministers/clergy members, state/county/tribal welfare agency, attorney, court appointed advocate, adult relatives, etc) letters or testimonials
- Copies of receipts, bills, payroll statements

### Unusual circumstances do not include:

- Parents refuse to contribute to the student's education
- Parents will not provide information for the FAFSA or verification
- Parents do not claim the student as a dependent for income tax purposes
- Student demonstrates total self-sufficiency

CSP uses a secure portal to collect and process Professional Judgements, students can access the portal either from CSP Connect or by going to csp.verifymyfafsa.com

Not all Professional Judgment requests will result in a change to a student financial aid package. The decision of the Financial Aid office is final, and cannot be appealed to the Department of Education.
